Eggnog

4 egg yolks
 1/3 c sugar + 1 tbsp
 1 pt whole milk
 1 c heavy cream
 3 oz bourbon
 1 tsp grated nutmeg
 4 egg whites

Beat egg yolks until they lighten in color. Gradually add 1/3 cup sugar and beat until dissolved. Add milk, cream, bourbon and nutmeg. Stir to combine. Beat egg whites until soft peaks form. With mixer still running, gradually add 1 tbsp sugar and beat until stiff peaks form. Whisk egg whites into mixture. Chill and serve.

Sugar Cookies

1 1/2 c powdered sugar
 1 c butter or margarine, softened
 1 tsp vanilla
 1/2 tsp almond extract
 1 egg
 2 1/2 c all-purpose flour
 1 tsp baking soda
 1 tsp cream of tartar

In a bowl combine powdered sugar, butter, vanilla, almond extract and egg. Stir in all-purpose flour, baking soda and cream of tartar. Cover and refrigerate for 2 hours. Heat oven to 375 degrees. Roll dough to 1/4" thick on a lightly floured surface. Cut out shapes using cookie cutters and place on lightly greased cookie sheet. Bake for 7-8 minutes or until edges are a light brown. Cool and serve.

Chocolate Fudge

3 c semi-sweet chocolate chips
 14 oz sweetened condensed milk
 3/4 c chopped nuts
 1 1/2 tsp vanilla extract
 Dash of salt

In a heavy saucepan, on low heat, melt chocolate chips with sweetened condensed milk and salt. Remove from heat; stir in nuts and vanilla. Spread evenly into wax paper-lined 9" square pan. Chill 2 hours or until firm. Lift fudge out of pan and place onto cutting board. Remove paper and cut into squares. Store covered in refrigerator.

Supplies

- Tea towel
- Accent fabric
- OESD Ultra Clean and Tear stabilizer

Instructions

1. Prep towel. Wash, dry, and iron tea towel. Trim towel to 25" long, be sure to trim from the bottom to preserve your hanging loop at the top.
2. Prep accent fabric. Measure the width of your tea towel, add 1" to that measurement (a), cut a 6" x (measurement a). Fold fabric's short sides in $\frac{1}{2}$ " and press, now match raw edges of the long sides (wrong sides together), press well. Sew short sides closed ($\frac{1}{8}$ " - $\frac{1}{4}$ " from the folded edge). **PHOTOS 1 & 2**
3. Sew fabric. Match raw edges of accent fabric to the right side of tea towel, sew using a $\frac{1}{2}$ " seam allowance. Finish edges with a zigzag, overlock, etc., press and topstitch on the towel. **PHOTOS 3 & 4**
4. Embroider towel. For this example, fold the towel in half and press to make a crease. I measured 3" from the bottom of the tea towel (not the accent fabric) to allow for fingertip/hand drying. Hoop using OESD Ultra Clean and Tear. After trimming threads, give your towel a final press using our Perfect Embroidery Press Cloth.

Tip: Use Ultra Clean & Tear instead of regular TearAway on woven fabrics with designs that have open spaces or lettering. Ultra Clean & Tear is partially water soluble and will fall apart when washing, leaving the supportive fibers under the design area.
